Reducing costly regulatory burden & improving efficiency



1 - Maintain current principles of the General Food Law Regulation, but check the impact of diverging interpretation & hence enforcement at national level









3 - Reflect on the use of LCA methodologies for hot-spot analysis and for continuous improvement of environmental performance & existing sustainability schemes



4 - Set up the European Energy Union enabling users to have access to competitive energy sources







5 - Favour education & awareness raising on healthy lifestyles rather than targeting food with nutrientrelated taxes

6 - Continued support for an ambitious CAP securing the supply of EU agricultural raw materials

7 - Enhance agricultural research & innovation efforts
