PFP statement on plenary EP vote on the revision of the Industrial Emissions Directive

For Primary Food Processors (<u>PFP</u>), the EU Green Deal sets an ambitious agenda for a more sustainable future for Europe. While we are supportive of, and committed to these objectives, the competitiveness of our industries of course remains a key concern.

We consider the European Parliament on the revision of the Industrial Emissions Directive (2010/75/EU), as adopted on 11 July 2023, as balanced overall, and a source of inspiration for the upcoming interinstitutional negotiations. Foremost, this applies to the sharing of information during the drawing up of BAT reference documents (article 13 paragraph 2) and to the setting of emission limit values and that of indicative environmental performance values (respectively article 15 paragraph 3 and 3a).
